Arcadia

~ Browning Mill Pond - there is a trail that begins in the main parking lot and goes clockwise around the entire pond. Along the trail is a fish hatchery, a ruin of an old shelter and a covered picnic area, There are also additional picnic tables at the end of the trail in a grassy area by the pond which is a nice area to spend a leisurely day canoeing, kayaking and/or fishing. However, swimming has not been allowed for several years. Arcadia Management Area, which this site is in the middle of, is one of the largest blocks of protected land in the state of Rhode Island. There are lots of other walking trails in the area as well.

Charlestown

- ~ Burlingame State Park Vin Gormley 8 mile looped trail; North Trail and connector trails bring you to Kimball Bird Sanctuary, Watchaug Pond, and Kettle Pond Visitor Center. See RI Parks for info
- ~ Francis C. Carter Preserve 6 miles of trails to choose from, based on your experience; take you through grassland, woodlands and by vernal pools. See Nature Conservancy RI for hike info
- ~ Ninigret National Wildlife Refuge/Kettle Pond Visitor Center lots of great activities for all ages and skill levels! Brochures and trail maps available at www.fws.gov/refuge/Ninigret/about.html and in the <Visit Visitor Activities> section the trail map links are at the bottom of the page.

Northern Trail Section (enter through Kettle Pond Visitor Center – refer to Kettle Pond Visitor Center Trail Map on website) - Upland forest on a glacial moraine; vernal pool; wood frogs; access to Kimball Bird Sanctuary and Watchaug Pond for birdwatching. Within the Refuge, the trails are well maintained, easy to hike and easy to follow. Note: there are several different trails, but Daisies and Brownies will find the ½ mile Ocean View Trail an easy walk to the viewing platform that looks out over Ninigret Pond to Block Island.

Southern Trail Section (enter through Ninigret Park- refer to Ninigret Trail map on website) - Formally part of Charlestown Naval Auxiliary Landing Field; over four miles of flat hiking trails; observation platform for view of the largest coastal salt pond in Rhode Island; parking areas at each entrance; seasonal rest rooms. Brochure available - Trails Through Time: A Self-Guided Journey

Other Info: There is plenty of parking for the northern trail section at the Kettle Pond Visitor Center. Inside the Visitor Center they have exhibits, maps, discovery station, classroom for field trips & meetings, rest rooms, nature store. Kingston

~ Camp Hoffman - there are trails for everyone right within the camp! Did you know that the Museum patch program includes a self-guided hike? Or that there is a Letterboxing tour of the camp? Just look for the big birdhouse at the entrance to get started! There are hikes for all ages at camp Hoffman... Daisies and Brownies can hike through camp and discover Gypsy Rest or Pooh Corner. Juniors and Cadettes can explore the trail system and visit the Greenwood Tree or the historic cemetery. Seniors and Ambassadors can maintain trails and lead younger scouts on adventures through a variety of habitats along the Paul Bunyan Trail. Reserve Tall Trees while you're there and you'll have a place for lunch and to make S'mores! For safety tips on the trail see: Brownie Hiker badge, Safety Activity Checkpoints, and LNT.org.

Narragansett

- ~ **Black Point** trailhead is located at 655 Ocean Rd, Narragansett, RI 02882 very short trail that includes Scarborough ruins and ends at rocky bluffs overlooking the ocean. Trails run along the bluff.
- ~ Canonchet Trail trail runs between Narragansett Community Center, Canonchet Farm and Narragansett Beach. Visit 'Friends of Canonchet; canonchet.org for Trail Map, Geology Trail Guide, Activities for Children, and Teacher's Guide to Children's Activities.

Narragansett (continued)

~ Whale Rock - The .5 mile easy trail leads to a scenic view of Narragansett Bay, Beavertail Lighthouse, and the remains of Whale Rock Lighthouse. Great for photography and sketching. Continuing south along the coastline brings you near the very limited parking near entrance to Camp Varnum at 33 Harvey Lane. Nature Conservancy (search maps online) rhodeislandlighthousehistory.info/whale_rock_lighthouse

North Kingstown

- ~ King Preserve (former Camp Narrow River) and the adjoining Benson Preserve* Trail maps are located throughout the woods within the Narrow River Watershed. Visit Girl Scout Beach on the upper basin or take one of the loops. *As of March 2017 some proposed trails were not open yet. Nature Conservancy RI for hike info
- ~ Rome Point at John H. Chafee Nature Preserve December to April viewing of Harbor Seals (check romepointseals.org for how and when), shorebirds, shoreline to explore.
- ~ Wilson Park The town park has a Walking Path, Playground, Nature Trail and more.

South Kingstown

- ~ National Wildlife Refuge Trustom Pond 3 miles of easy trails through grasslands and shoreline trees with a visitor contact station, observation platforms, and wildlife to view and photograph. See FWS
- ~ Old Mountain Field est. 1938 Trails enter the woods at several locations, most are an easy hike. There is one section that begins near the Indian Run Reservoir and roams upward until you stand at the top of the old quarry face. Choose the right trail and you'll climb the stone steps carved into the remaining stone. There is also a perfect beginner trail for Daisies and Brownies that goes around the small pond behind the field bring a picnic snack to share on the bank.
- ~ South Kingstown Land Trust trail maps at sklt.org
- ~ Crawley Preserve SK/Richmond 2+ miles of ascending/descending hilled, wooded trails that crisscross on the upper end.
- ~ DuVal Trail 4 miles of hill and kettle topography, moderate hike, view of the ocean and Block Island from scenic overlook.
- ~ Thewlis Trail 0.8 mile hiking trail of eastern white pine, scarlet oak, and beech. Turkey, coyote, fisher, and many other animals find food and shelter on this property, located near the center of Wakefield.
- ~ Trustom Pond National Wildlife Refuge
- ~ Kettle Pond and Visitor's Center
- ~ Weeden Trail easy 1.2 mile trail at the SKLT Barn featuring stone walls, hay/corn fields, wildlife habitat and a large grove of larch trees. Stone Wall Geology Tour available for download.
- ~ Yawgoo Trail 1.26 mile looped trail takes the hiker by a kettle hole bog, over Mud Brook, and through white pine trees and views of Yawgoo Pond.

West Greenwich

~ Tillinghast Pond Management Area, Plain Meeting House Road – 4 loops and the Logger Trail allow a variety of short walks up to a 10 mile hike. See NC - RI for hike info

Westerly

~ Wahaneeta Preserve (former Girl Scout Camp) - Various trails take you by the old Lodge, over brooks and to the Pavilion. Educator Guides available. See WLT
